Camellia Japonica

1. 3 Blooms different varieties (**Boon Trophy**)
2. One bloom of a variety introduced into New Zealand before 1910
(**Founders Trophy**)
(see **Rule 14b** for eligible varieties.)

Camellia Hybrids with other than Reticulata parentage

3. 3 Blooms different varieties (**Les Jury Memorial Trophy**)

Individual Blooms not restricted to a particular variety or species

4. One White bloom. (**Rayner Memorial Trophy**)
5. One bloom, of American Origin (**American Camellia Society's Trophy**)
6. One bloom of Australian Origin (**Colin Elliot Trophy**)
7. One bloom of New Zealand Origin. (**Edith Mazzei Trophy**)
8. One miniature bloom, any species or variety, (see Rule 11) (**Clere Memorial Trophy**)
9. One Bloom of a Camellia Bred by Neville Haydon. (**Neville Haydon Trophy**) (see rule 14c)

Camellia Reticulata and Hybrid with Reticulata parentage

10. 3 Blooms different varieties (**Des & Joyce Crowley Trophy**)

Seedling Classes

11. One bloom, **Japonica** seedling (**Clark Cup**)
12. One bloom, **Reticulata** or **Reticulata Hybrid** seedling (**Clark Cup**)

RULES

Please refer to rule 18 for clarification

1. **To aid stewarding please do not place pottles on benching cards.**
2. Exhibitors must be financial members of the New Zealand Camellia Society.
3. All flowers must have been grown by the exhibitor. For seedling camellias, the name of the "raiser" must be given in all classes.
4. Indication that you wish to enter blooms to the show need to be forwarded to the registrar one week prior. Late entries, see entry procedure (6) at front, may be accepted at the discretion of the Chief Steward up to **8.00am on Saturday 22nd August 2026**, provided there is available space on the tables. Space will be made available for any late entries in the Seedling classes.
5. **There is an entry limit of one entry per person per class.**
6. Benching closes at **8.30am Saturday 22nd August 2026**
7. **The Chief Steward reserves the right to reject any blooms entered in the wrong class or may transfer them to the correct class**
8. The Chief Judge's decision shall be final on all matters connected with the competition.
9. All blooms, except those in the seedling classes, must be exhibited with their own natural foliage not necessarily attached.
10. All blooms entered, except Seedling, must be from varieties named in the Camellia Nomenclature published by Southern California Camellia Society, or the International Camellia Register, or registered with the American Camellia Society, the Australian Camellia Research Society or the New Zealand Camellia Society or as noted in Rule 14.
11. Bloom sizes for classes restricted by size. **Blooms must fit through the Ring without touching** Rings for sizing will be available on the benching tables. Please do **not** separate the rings from their groups. In these classes **Nomenclature registered sizes will NOT be used - the blooms will be classed by their actual sizes on the day.**

Sizes for classes will be:

Miniature:	under 7cm
Miniature to small:	under 8.5cm
Small	7cm to 8.5cm
Medium:	8.5cm to 10.5cm
Large:	10.5cm - 13cm
Very Large:	over 13cm

NOTE: Blooms must be within the sizes designated above and characteristic of the varieties concerned.

12. All individual blooms, except Seedling must be named on the benching cards, and with the multiple classes use the card strips provided on the show tables to name each individual bloom.
13. A seedling, sport or mutation cannot be entered in Classes 11 and 12 if it has been registered, sold offered for sale either by the originator or others, or exhibited in these classes at two previous national shows.
- 14(a) For the purposes of the show, "rusticana" blooms shall be treated as "japonica" and cultivars listed in Camellia Nomenclature under "saluenensis" as non-reticulata hybrids.

Best Seedling Bloom (**Maire Trophy**)

Best Miniature Bloom (**Moore Memorial Trophy**)

Best Small Bloom (**Harold Austin Memorial Trophy**)

Best Japonica Bloom (**McLisky Trophy**)

Best Hybrid Bloom with no Reticulata parentage (**Council Trophy**)

Best Reticulata or Reticulata Hybrid Bloom (**Roland Young Memorial Trophy**)

Champion Bloom of the show (Bethwaite Memorial Trophy)
